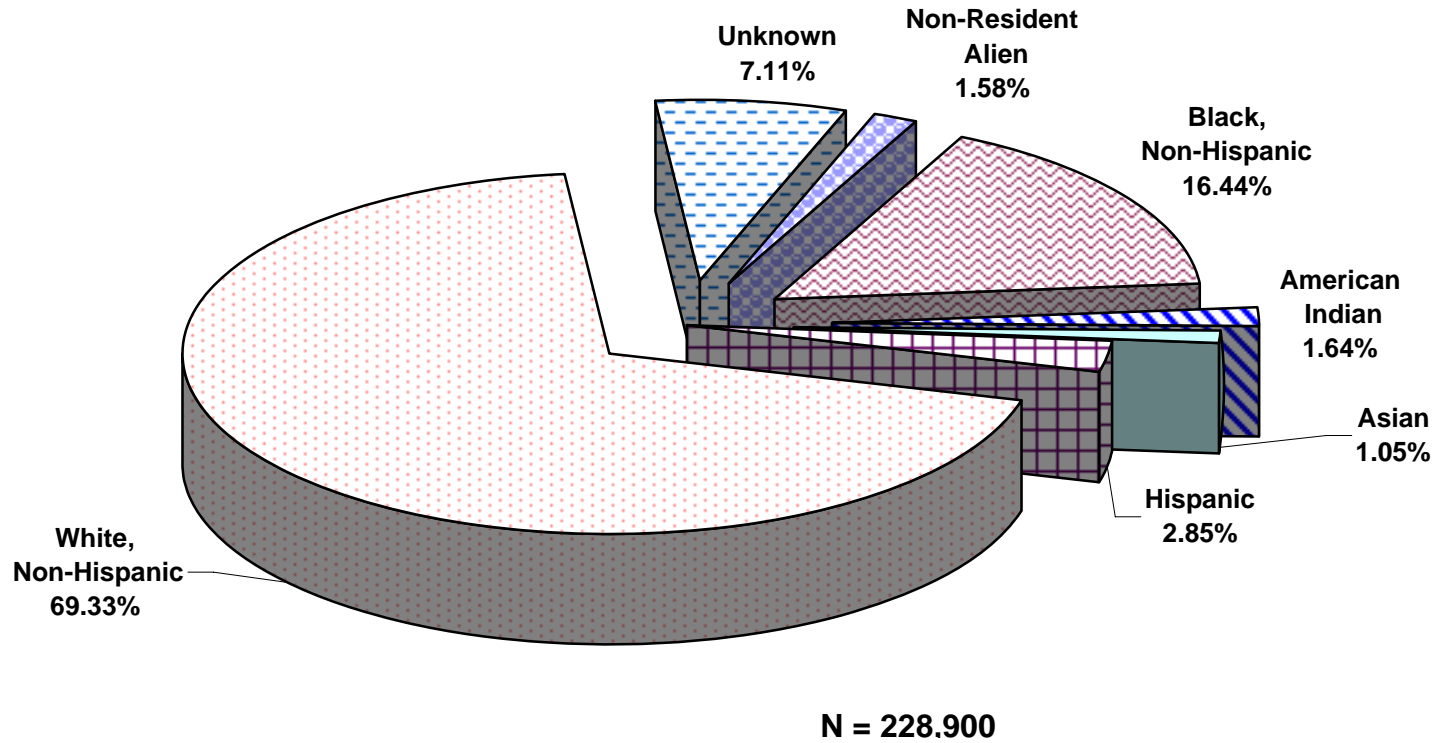


## TOTAL YEAR-END PROGRAM ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY, 2005-06

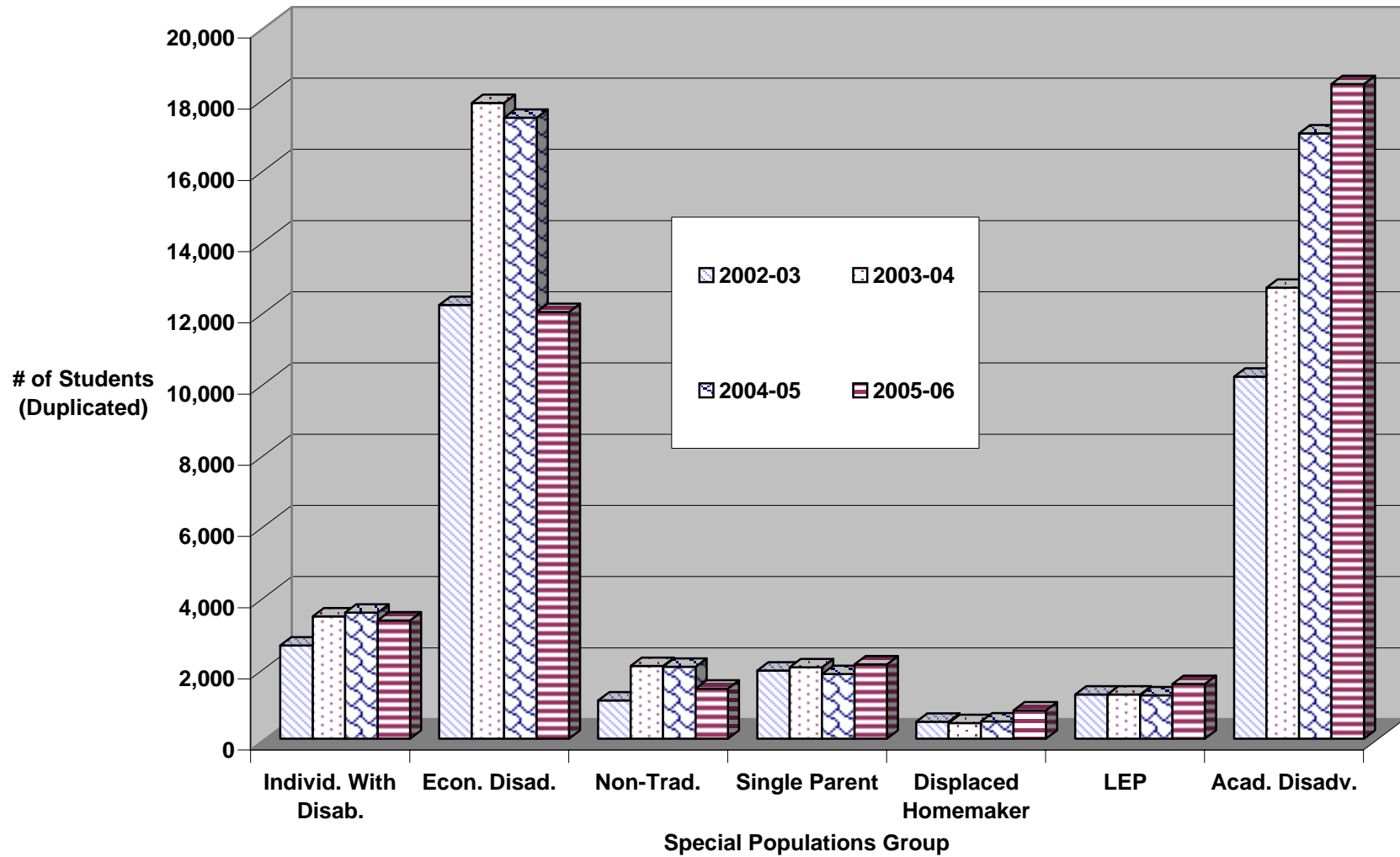
