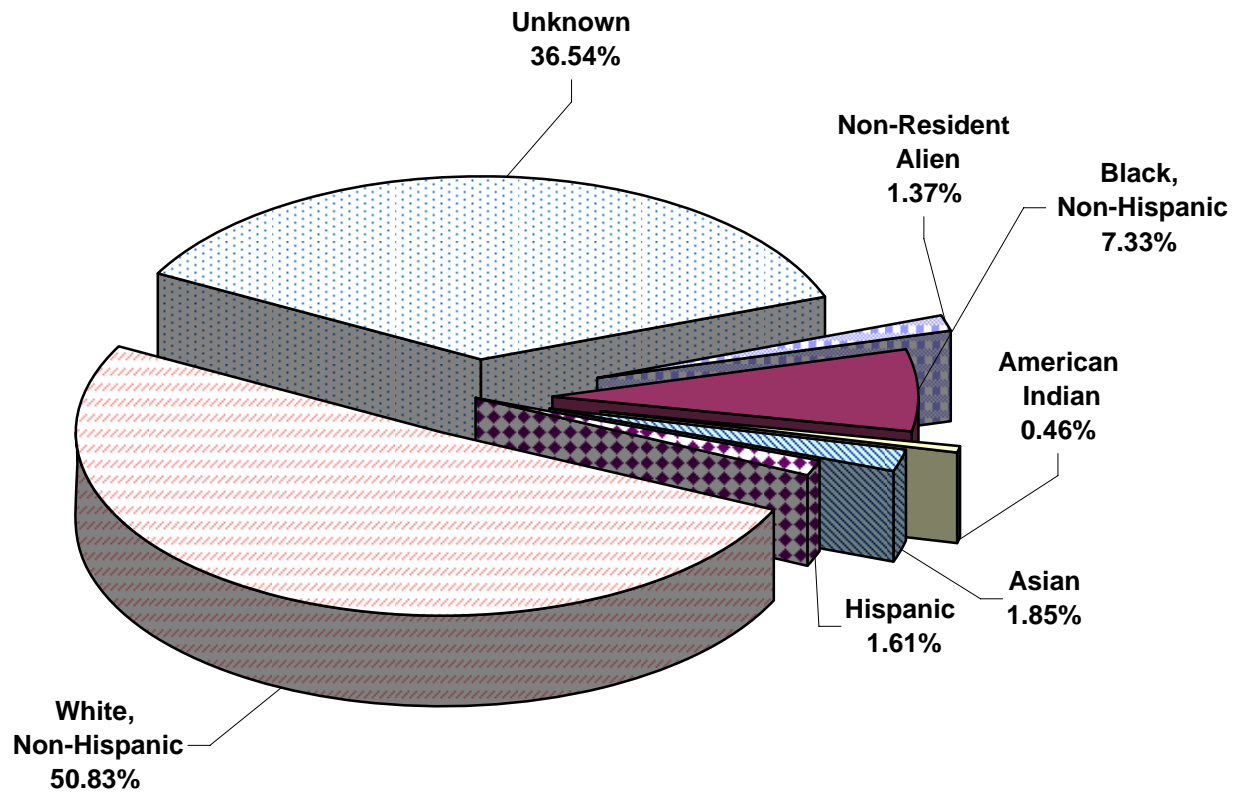


### TOTAL NON-PROGRAM ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY, 2006-07

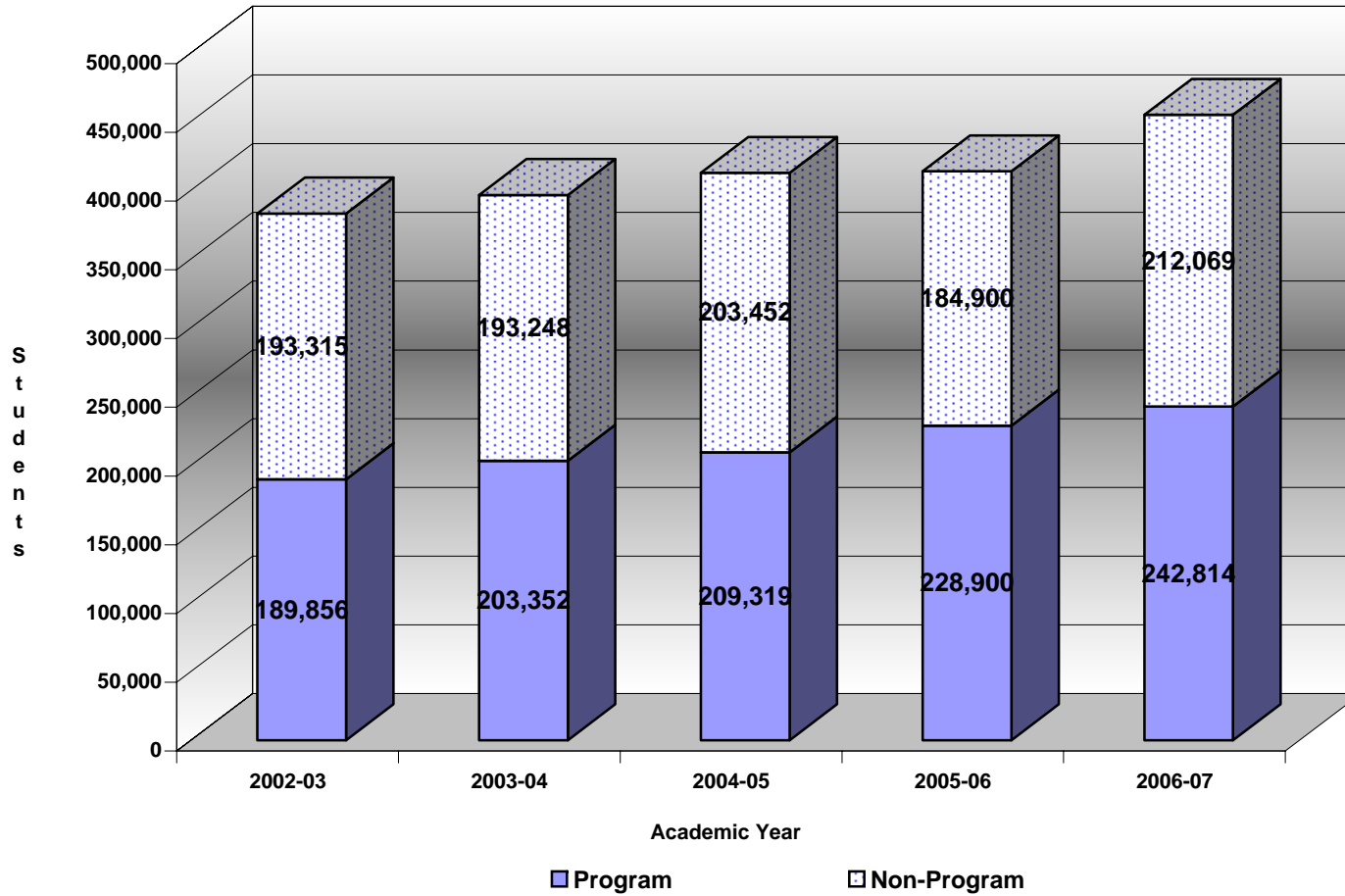
